1992 Workshop for Specialists

Methods and specific techniques to enhance active clinicians' treatment skills will be the main focus at a workshop sponsored by the Stuttering Foundation of America and Northwestern University on July 6-17, 1992.

Organizers of the sixth annual *Stuttering Therapy: Workshop for Specialists* will provide a situation in which active clinicians can enrich their knowledge about stuttering and enhance their treatment skills. Principles that provide a rationale for the decision making process will also be carefully considered.

This program fills a need for specialized training to work with adults and children who stutter. There are now over 100 graduates of this program who make up the beginnings of a nationwide network of specialists. Many of the graduates have gone on to create

CBS Runs Public-Service Announcement Nationally

On Sunday, November 25th, CBS aired the Stuttering Foundation's 30-second public-service announcement on stuttering nationally during the afternoon football game!

On Sunday, December 15th, CBS once again aired the 30-second PSA during the Redskins football game. This brought responses from as far away as the Aleutian Islands.

In a December 24th letter to SFA President Jane Fraser, the Assistant to the President of CBS, Vice President Beth Bressan writes, "We will continue the message in our rotation, and I will see if there are any relevant entertainment programs which might warrant a special airing."

We are indebted to CBS for donating this valuable prime time to the Stuttering Foundation.

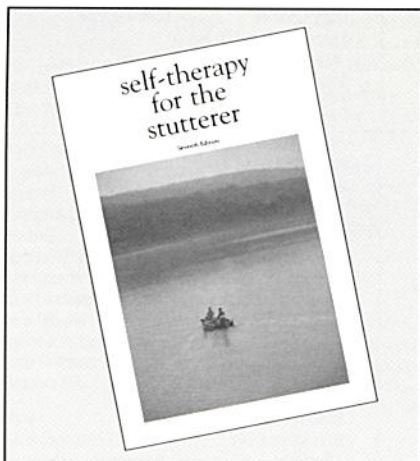
ABC Airs Public-Service Announcement For Over Ten Months

In New York, WABC-Channel 7 continues to run our 15-second PSA several times a week and our 30-second public-service announcement several times a month. This tremendous support has enabled us to reach tens of thousands of New Yorkers whose lives have been affected by stuttering. We are grateful for the continuing support of our cause by the ABC Television Network.

Panama City's WJHG Airs PSA

The NBC affiliate in Panama City, WJHG, is presently airing our 30-second public-service announcement on stuttering. This has enabled us to reach those who stutter in a part of the country where we have previously had little impact. We are indebted to WJHG for getting our PSA on tape and on the air.

Self-Therapy Receives Worldwide Recognition



Thanks to numerous translations, Malcolm Fraser's *Self-Therapy for the Stutterer*, Seventh Edition, is reaching more and more people around the world.

In Japan, *Self-Therapy* was translated into Japanese by two physicians this year. It should be available to the Japanese public in early 1992.

In Iran, Dr. Ali Afrooz of the University of Tehran has translated *Self-Therapy* into Persian, and the book is being distributed throughout Iran.

The graduate students at the University of Witwatersrand in South Africa hope to translate the book into

Zulu this year for distribution in those areas of South Africa where Zulu is spoken.

The Academic Press in Haryana, India, has asked permission to print and distribute *Self-Therapy for the Stutterer* throughout India.

Self-Therapy for the Stutterer has been available in French and German for some time now and can be obtained from the self-help groups in those countries. Most of these translations have been done by professionals who stutter themselves and wanted to share this book with others in their country.

Newspapers Feature Stuttering and the Stuttering Foundation of America

In 1991, the following newspapers ran articles on stuttering and the Stuttering Foundation. Most articles included our toll-free Hotline on Stuttering, 1-800-992-9392, as well as descriptions of our books and brochures.

SFA mailed three major press releases to 1,650 daily newspapers in 1991. The first, dated January 7, 1991,

was entitled "Beware of Quick Cures for Stuttering." On April 8, 1991, "National Stuttering Awareness Week Offers Opportunity for Greater Understanding" was sent; and on August 1, 1991, "Easy to Recognize, Hard to Understand, Stuttering Causes Back-to-School Woes" was the focus of the autumn press release.

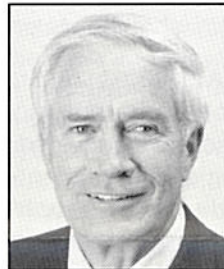

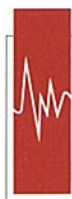

A Stutterer's Story, by Frederick P. Murray, Ph.D., is now available from the Stuttering Foundation of America.

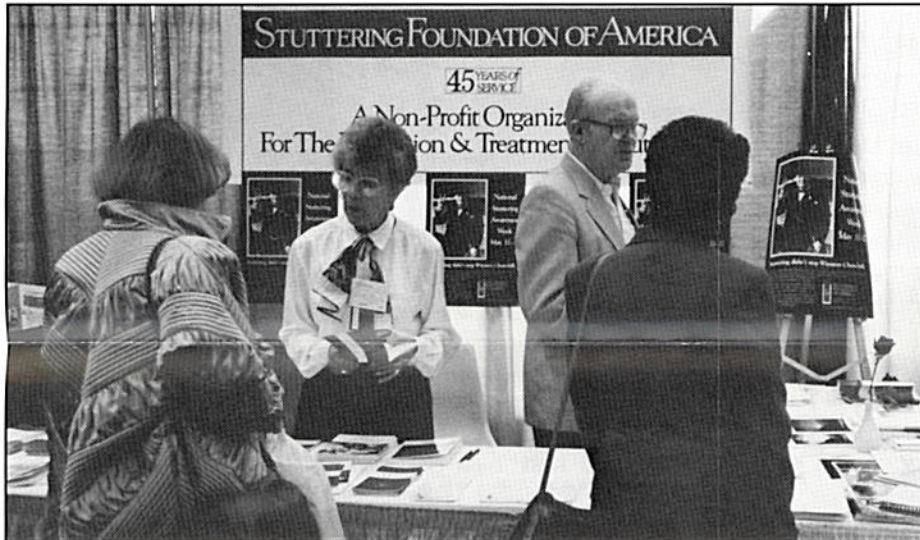

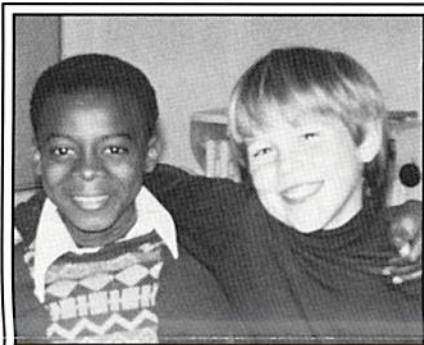

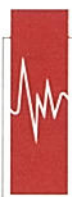

Activities during the 12-day workshop will include lectures, discussions, guided observations of clinical evaluation and treatment, videotaped illustrations, broad consideration of available techniques, direct instruction and the practice of procedures, and the sharing of experience.

Admission is limited to those who have demonstrated an active interest in stuttering and the deadline for application is May 15.
